

Sample Language to Make a Gift in your Will or Trust to Notre Dame College Prep

If you are making a new will or trust, you can simply include Notre Dame College Prep among the beneficiaries of your estate. If you already have a will, you can make NDCP a beneficiary of your estate through a simple document called a codicil.

Notre Dame College Prep is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporation, with Federal Taxpayer Identification Number 36-2387144.

Your bequest language can be as simple as the following:

General Bequest:

I hereby bequeath to Notre Dame College Prep, a tax-exempt organization, located at
7655 W. Dempster Street, Niles IL 60714, the sum of dollars (or,
alternatively,% of my residuary estate, or include a description of property, assets,
etc. that you wish to bequeath) for its general purposes.
Specific Bequest:
I hereby bequeath to Notre Dame College Prep, a tax-exempt organization, located at
7655 W. Dempster Street, Niles IL 60714, the sum of dollars (or,
alternatively,% of my residuary estate, or include a description of property, assets,
etc. that you wish to bequeath). It is my wish that this gift be specifically used to support
[describe specific intent here - scholarships, athletics, student services, etc.]. If it
becomes inappropriate or impossible to accomplish the purpose of the gift as described
herein, then the Board of Governors may designate this bequest to be used for the benefit
of a substantially similar purpose.

Specifying a percentage of your estate as a bequest is generally preferable to specifying a dollar amount. It means that the beneficiaries of your estate, including tax-exempt not-for-profit organizations like NDCP, will receive the proportion you intend, even though your estate may increase or decrease in value.
